	The feature addresses would explore the intersection of digital transformation and sustainability in advancing regional trade. The speakers would begin by outlining the current trade landscape, highlighting the region’s dependence on traditional trade systems and the disruptions caused by global phenomena such as the pandemic, AI technologies, etc. The addresses would emphasize how digital tools such as e-commerce platforms, paperless trade systems, and artificial intelligence can streamline logistics, reduce inefficiencies, and improve cross-border trade processes. Additionally, the speakers will also be invited to explore how technology can support regional cooperation and the harmonization of policies to better connect Greater Caribbean countries and to connect the region to the rest of the world. The addresses would also acknowledge challenges, such as infrastructure gaps, cybersecurity concerns, and resistance to digital adoption, while stressing the need for capacity building and cross-sector collaboration.
